THIS MONTH IN AMERICAN REVOLUTION HISTORY

Rhode Island: First & Last

First: Rhode Island was the first colony to declare its independence from England on 4 May 1776 thereby breaking ties with King George III. It would be two months before any of the other 12 colonies declare their independence. Rhode Island's General Assembly did so in a nearly unanimous vote.

Last: Rhode Island was the last of the 13 colonies to ratify the U.S. Constitution. It voted to do so on 29 May 1790.

The official name of the state is "Rhode Island and Providence Plantations." Its name resulted from the consolidation of four settlements.
